



### Konrad Zielinski,

FIG Honorary member Konrad Zielinski, who actively contributed to the development of Acrobatic Gymnastics for more than three decades, died on 8 March 2021, at the age of 87, seven weeks after his wife passed away, Gizela Zielinska, who was another dedicated servant of the sport.

As an athlete, he represented Poland in Artistic Gymnastics international competitions before discovering the new Acrobatic Sports emerging from the Soviet Union. His passion motivated him to develop and organise these new disciplines in Poland.

Founder of a club in Warsaw, he worked there as a coach for many years and became the national coach of the Polish Team, leading athletes to numerous medals in World and European Championships. He also acted as the president of the Polish Sports Acrobatics Federation from 1993 to 2000.

Concurrently, from the foundation of the International Federation of Sports Acrobatic (IFSA) in late 1973, he was deeply involved in the development of the first international rules.

Member and chair of the IFSA Technical Committee over two decades, then a member of the IFSA Executive Committee until the merger within the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG) in

1999, and eventually a member of the FIG Acrobatic Gymnastics Technical Committee for two terms, he devoted years to creating the judging rules, competition rules and classification of routines.

For his longstanding services to the sport, he was appointed FIG honorary member when he retired in 2008.

The FIG expresses its sincere condolences to his family.

On behalf of the FIG Acrobatics Technical Committee and the acro community, we express our deepest sympathy to his family and friends.
